GRADUATION PROJECT

The project explored housing proposals for remote indigenous communities in the Anangu Pitjantjatjara Lands in the north west corner of South Australia. Key aspects of the project were to look at:

- What it meant to inhabit the western desert landscape
- The impact that improvements to the living environment can have upon health and the reduction of infectious disease
- Indigenous household structures. How people used to live, how they live now and how they would like to live
- Public and community housing provision in remote areas
- Prefabricated and pre-assembled structures appropriate to climate, context and culture

The project outcomes consisted of a design for a pre-fabricated, modular system, consisting of a kit of parts that could be used to: construct rooms, verandahs and yard spaces in a variety of configurations to accommodate several different households' needs.
